

Summer Landscaping Plans

Plenty of landscaping activity is scheduled for Deer Crest's Queen Esther entrance area this spring. There are plans to bring in some new containers for the pilaster flowers and some of the old bark mulch has already been replaced with a handsome landscape rock. We should have both road shoulders along the Queen Ester entrance road adorned with the new rock by midsummer. Last fall a complete makeover of the planted islands just inside the Q.E. gate was begun and those areas will be finished up this spring as well.

Flower baskets will be placed around the Jordanelle gate entrance and those islands will also be subject to a minor makeover.

More flowers will also be added to the lower Q.E. gate area in preparation for a future makeover down there.

Numerous other ongoing projects will take place such as thinning dead trees in the open spaces, reseeding ski runs and cut banks, and planting additional trees.

The tulips and daffodils are already popping up which means summer will be here soon.



Noxious Weed Control

Both the State of Utah and Wasatch County have detailed weed abatement plans and both entities require private land owners to actively control listed weeds. The Deer Crest operations staff annually puts a lot of effort toward noxious weed control and we've seen positive improvement each year. However, it's virtually impossible for us to maintain control in Deer Crest's common areas if these weeds are allowed to grow unchecked on the private residences and lots.

With this in mind we have developed a weed abatement program with the intent of making it simple and easy for all homeowners to participate in the "greening" of Deer Crest. The HOA has negotiated with a local weed control company, EcoLawn, for a special group rate for our owners. They can be contacted at 844-693-2652 to sign up for the service which consists of at least 2 visits, per lot, per growing season, by a licensed weed-control specialist.

Of course, If a property owner already has an active, working weed plan in place they should maintain that program and let the operations staff know so we can update our records. Owners and property managers alike should check out the link on our web site that is very helpful: www.utahweed.org.

Construction Update



It's an obvious fact in 2018 that Deer Crest continues to be a preferred location to own a home. Eight homes have changed hands in the last year, Lots 4, 34, 62, 91, 101, 110, 131 and 145. The Deer Crest Master Association wants to take this time to welcome all the new home owners to the Community.

There are currently six homes under construction, lots 1U, 8U, 64, 82, 98 and 142. Lot 87 is being remodeled with lots 133 and 139 thinking to do the same. Lots 131 and multiple Hidden Hollow lots may be looking to design and build in the near future.

Construction at Deer Crest is permitted from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Construction is not allowed on Sundays and holidays. Please be careful as you drive through the development, especially near construction sites, and feel free to let operations staff or a gatehouse attendants know if you encounter any problems with construction personnel. If you do report something, information such as Lot number/location, license plate number, vehicle description and time of incident will help us in correcting problems.

Summer Road Work Plans



Annual summer road maintenance is currently in the planning stages at Deer Crest. "Crack sealing" and spot patching are both processes that take place each year and impact the entire development. An application of "slurry seal" is planned for the Snow Top roadway. We are working with the contractors to try and schedule these projects during the slow season when homeowner traffic is at a minimum, most likely sometime in May. If you're here during these operations, please be patient as some traffic delays may be possible.

Trash Can Policy

Now that we are getting more homes in our community we need to be more mindful of our trash pickup procedures. If trash cans are put out too early the frequent influx of new fresh air (high winds!) blows them over and, with the help of wildlife, their contents get spread across the development. In the winter the cans really impede snow removal operations in addition to being unsightly so we ask that you please have your property managers put the cans out the morning of pick-up and then put them away by that night. If you have special circumstances where this is not possible, please let us know and we will see if we can be of assistance.

Queen Esther Gate Vehicle Restrictions



The Deer Crest HOA would like to remind all owners, visitors, and builders at Deer Crest about the vehicle restrictions for the Queen Esther entrance which are listed below:

- Access through the Queen Esther gate is limited to home and property owners, their family and guests, current property managers and staff, authorized representatives of the owner, general contractors and architects of an owner, taxis and airport vans. Access is also only allowed for registered guests of the St Regis Hotel arriving in chauffeured transportation.
- Access for authorized residential service providers, repairmen and vendors, identified real estate
 brokers and agents, and courier and commercial deliveries to completed homes is limited to business hours, or by appointment. In an effort to help reduce traffic flow through the Queen Esther
 Gates, please request that your service people and vendors use the Jordanelle Gate when appropriate.
- All traffic authorized to use the Queen Esther entrance must be no larger than a ¾ ton truck or 16 seat passenger van. We would like to remind owners to direct all vehicles larger than this to the Jordanelle entrance.
- <u>All construction traffic,</u> construction deliveries, recreation vehicles, vehicles pulling trailers, semi tractor trailer rigs, and all vehicles with three or more axles (large delivery trucks) and medium or large busses must use the Jordanelle Gate entrance.

We would also like to remind all Owners and Property Managers to keep their guest and authorized access lists up to date with the Queen Esther or Jordanelle gate houses. Their phone numbers are 435-645-9872 and 435-647-5961 respectively.
